PRESIDENT'S REPORT

After the interruptions and uncertainty around our netball competition for the past couple of years, it was fantastic to get through a full 2022 season with minimal government mandated lockdowns. Although at times, it was uncertain what the season might look like we were fortunate that we were able to proceed with a full season. I would like to acknowledge the incredible hard work all of our club coordinators and volunteers did week in, week out to ensure that their clubs were able to field teams despite the impact of COVID on all teams throughout the season.

The 2022 season saw the implementation of Play HQ, as MyNetball was phased out at the end of the last year. Thanks to all of our Club Registrars and Volunteers who attended the Workshops to learn the new system. Play HQ saw a number of challenges for all of us, particularly around refunds and scorecards and we continue to provide feedback to Netball WA on these key areas of concern for our members.

This year saw the continuation of the Umpiring Grant Program which was made available to all clubs. We had 10 clubs participate this year, which was a slight reduction in the number of participating clubs from last year. This program will be reviewed in the off season, along with all umpiring programs, with the aim of improving the development opportunities offered to all umpires.

The Fuel to Go & Play Member Association Championships were held at Matthews over the June long weekend, where PNA had 21 teams represented. We had the strongest results that we've seen in many years, with 7 teams winning their division and another 3 finishing runners-up. This result is a testament to the hard work of Tibbie Galbraith and our Association Coaches. Many of these athletes have been part of PNA Development pathways for a number of years now and the strength and development of these players is a result of the strong programs that have been developed. Tibbie has also worked with other ADO's from WDNA and FNA to develop further opportunities for our athletes to participate in Round Robin carnivals, which better equips them for the competition format.

This year was the final year of PNA's current strategic plan, and as part of developing the 2023 – 2025 Strategic Plan, Clubs were given the opportunity to provide feedback to inform the decision making around key focus areas. Thanks to Rick Smith, our external consultant, and Anne Gribble for their work on the Club Survey. The survey results were largely positive, but assisted the Executive in identifying key focus areas over the next three years. The key issues raised will also form the basis for the Club Forum next month, which will allow us to work together and collaborate to find solutions to some of these issues.

Round 8 saw PNA celebrate NAIDOC round. We were assisted by the Town of Cambridge in developing a better understanding of the Aboriginal history of the area where Matthews is located, which we were able to share with our members. We were also fortunate to have a number of our members contribute to Acknowledgements of Country over the PA system at the start of each timeslot for Saturday matches. PNA also participated in the Netball WA NAIDOC Carnival held at Matthews on 6th July. It was the first time PNA had participated in the carnival and our team, coached by Fiona Cohen, finished runner-up in its division.

PNA held our Mental Health Round in Round 14. Players in the Year 7/8, Junior 9-12 and Open Competitions wore blue arm bands and Clubs were provided with information to enable coaches and volunteers to have conversations with their players about the significance of the round and to better equip them with tools in understanding mental health. Psychologist Jodii Maguire from Think Performance also ran a Mental Health Awareness Workshop in the week leading up to the round. While the feedback was fantastic, the attendance at the workshop was low and we will look at the best time of year to run this workshop in 2023 as the end of the season is a very busy time for Club Volunteers.

This season saw the launch of PNA's Instagram account, which allowed for us to better connect with members about upcoming clinics, programs and even featured a Rule of The Week Segment. Thanks to Maddie Wood for her work on our Social Media as it allows us to distribute more information directly to our members.

Unfortunately, the project to resurface the worn 12 hard courts and light them was delayed from the original start date of December 2021. The works involved in the project were much more significant than originally understood and required more time and the commitment of additional funds from the Council. Troy and I attended a meeting of the Town of Cambridge Community & Resources Committee in July, where I presented our need for the work to be completed and the lighting to enable greater use of the courts and to realign the courts to comply with updated run off requirements for the safety of players, umpires and spectators. We are extremely fortunate that the Town of Cambridge supported the projects and is willing to share the cost with PNA. The court works are due to start next month and will be completed in time for the start of the 2023 Winter season. The court lighting will follow as a separate project.

Troy and Mercia continued to work with Healthway to ensure we provide healthy food and drink options from the Courtside Cafe. We have received very positive feedback from Healthway and will continue to work with them in the future to ensure that this continues. Thanks to Mercia for all of her work this year. Our canteen staff at times were particularly hard hit with COVID, but continued to provide a fantastic service to our members.

I would again like to thank all of our Club Coordinators, volunteers and members who enable us to successfully complete the 2022 Season. The last few years have been extremely demanding on our volunteers and we appreciate all you do for your clubs and PNA.

I would like to thank our Office staff, Heather, Hannah, Ashlin, Ashby, Tibbie and Jo as they continue to work hard, learning new systems, helping to upskill our members and identifying areas where we can continue to improve our Competition.



Thanks to Troy for overseeing the running of the Office, Canteen, Grounds and anything else we need. Troy's work in ensuring the resurfacing and lighting of our courts goes ahead has been invaluable and we appreciate all you do behind the scenes.

Lastly, I would like to thank the Executive and members of our various Coaching, Umpiring and Grading Committees for all their hard work over the last 12 months. Many of you already contribute to your clubs, and I greatly appreciate the additional time and skills you are willing to contribute to this Association. We are fortunate to have members who are so passionate about netball and who enable us to continue to grow and improve.

PNA ACADEMY

2022 saw the end of the Netball WA Metro Academy and provided a fantastic opportunity for the Associations to create and include a new program in the development calendar. The aim of the Academy program is to bridge the gap between the WANL underpinning programs and the Associations Championships.

The inaugural year of the PNA Academy consisted of four teams lead by seven coaches who embarked on an intensive six-week program. The program provided athletes with on court development lead by their coaches as well as off court development. Each session consisted of an off-court development component that replicates the WANL and elite pathway structure. Our coaches received mentoring throughout the program from Sophie Szabo. The PNA Academy completed their program with a tournament held at WDNA and saw our teams competing against WDNA, FNA, Eastern Hills and Rockingham.

UMPIRE DEVELOPMENT OFFICER'S REPORT

The 2022 season has been challenging but with great success. The biggest challenge came from illness and the availability of the umpires which caused some changes to plans, however we achieved some great outcomes with umpire development and we are building a more inclusive and supportive culture amongst all the PNA umpires. We have focused on the following key areas.

- Greater engagement from all clubs in umpire development
- Increase the number of accredited umpires
- Provide development opportunities for all umpires
- Work with Netball WA to promote umpire development and pathways
- Establish a PNA Umpire Squad and an Emerging Squad
- Improve umpire recruitment and retention

Engagement with Clubs

The biggest thing we managed to achieve is the dialog between the clubs and between the clubs and association. There have been a high number of umpire swaps and sharing of umpires to allow all games to be umpired but people capable of doing those games. This also resulted in some swaps to allow umpires to be assessed for their C badges.

With only Open 1 and 9-12 Div 1 being allocated, clubs have been providing their own umpires and providing a list of names for coaching and development opportunities.

We are working on ways to simplify the process of requesting coaching and assessment of umpires. This will need to be reviewed and developed further. The biggest challenge comes from the change in the online learning platform which has changed the way we proceed with getting umpires assessed.

Squad Selection

Criteria for the umpire squad were formed into an internal policy and published by PNA. An expression of interest was circulated prior to the commencement of the season, including the benefits and expectations of being a member of squad. This is to ensure clubs are clear on the framework for squad membership and that it does not mean that umpire is lost for allocation on club games.

Emerging Squad

The purpose of the Emerging Squad is to retain and provide support to umpires who demonstrate a desire to progress along the Netball Australia umpire pathway. They may also assist the AUDO to coach new (green shirt) umpires at the Association.

As this was the first time we ran an Emerging Squad, there are areas for improvement but we had good development and a good interaction between members of the squad and senior squad which aided in their development and hopefully aid in retention of those umpires.

Umpire Coaches

Squad umpires have again been working as umpire coaches this season. We have been focusing on supporting new umpires for smaller clubs on Friday night and Saturday Mornings and helping develop umpires to achieve their C badge. We are working to provide clubs support for their C badge umpires to learn how to coach so they can help develop the beginning umpires and then the PNA squad can spend more time coaching and developing C Badge umpires to reach higher levels of competition.

There has again been difficulty in coaching in the 2.30/4pm time slots due to umpire coach availability. This issue began to improve in the second half of the year as the rate of absences for the variety of

reasons decreased. We are working with A and AA umpires to help develop our umpires to achieve their B badge and continue to develop our B badged umpires.

PNA provided 3 umpire coaching workshops to help umpire coaches improve their knowledge and support more consistent feedback.

The implementation of an electronic feedback form for umpire coaching began at the end of 2020 and we have continued to develop and use this form in 2022. The form covers three aspects of development:

1. The appropriate assignment of umpires.
2. Setting individual development KPIs.
3. Badge level screening.

We have developed a guide to using the forms that helps umpire coaches use the form better, which has improved the consistency of the feedback.

School Holiday Umpire Workshops

Three workshops were held in the April and July school holidays with a fourth to be held in the upcoming October school holidays. The workshops have seen in excess of 55 aspiring umpires for each session. In addition, we ran a similar program aimed at adult beginning umpires which was well attended and resulted in 1 C badge in 2022 and the possibility of more in 2023.

These workshops are now being run by the AUDO. A number of our umpires assisted with the practical component of the programs.

IGSSA

PNA ran a green shirt program during the IGSSA competition providing good opportunities for new umpires to gain experience and coaching.

Green Shirt Program

During Spring 2021, PNA ran a Green Shirt Program with beginning umpires, umpiring mostly the yr 6 division with some of the umpires on yr 5 games. We had 45 umpires in 2021.

Rules Discussion events

Rules information sessions were run on the 4th and 27th of April for Primary and secondary/open aged competition umpires.

A game management workshop was run on the 11th May and 8th August to aid understanding of the behaviour management process and injury/illness protocols.

Association Championships

PNA entered 19 teams and 2 No Limits teams for Association Championships over the long weekend, 4th June -6th June 2022. All games were covered by badged umpires.

Trials and Match Play for Association Championships:

We had 42 umpires participate in trials across selections for Association Champs and PNA Metro Academy Teams. We increased the group of people we invited to include all new C badged umpires and talented umpires from our Spring Green Shirt Program and umpires identified by the clubs.

Badging

A total of 34 C Badges have been awarded this year. A full list of badged umpires for 2022 is included in Appendix 3. We have the potential of badging a large number of B badge umpires next year and hopefully for many years to come. It has been difficult this year with the change to the learning

platform, but the clubs and umpires have been helpful in providing the information needed to complete the number of C's we have.
